

# **ARTISTIC DISCIPLINES**

Victoria School of the Arts is known for the enthusiastic risk-taking and artistic discipline of its students who have embraced the power of the arts to transform lives. In an environment of celebration, our students continue to challenge themselves beyond their current limits. They are encouraged to question, express and pursue their artistic interests.

## **ELEMENTARY ARTS**

Elementary students' classroom experiences are enriched through art, dance, drama and music. Workshops, guest artists, hands-on experiences, integrated projects and performance opportunities allow all students to learn through and develop an appreciation for the arts. All students have the opportunity to create and perform work in a variety of settings both in school and in the community.

## **SECONDARY ARTS**

Junior high students continue to explore the arts by selecting options that include choral music, dance, drama, instrumental music, visual art and media. As the arts are an integral part of our work, they are integrated into all subjects. Students will continue to have the opportunity to share work with an audience through class projects and select auditioned performances.

The ability to further specialize in each artistic discipline continues in senior high school as more courses in each of the five disciplines of dance, media, music, theatre and visual arts are available. Increased opportunity for auditioned projects and performances, as well as creative art installations and exhibits enhance and showcase class work. Senior high students are encouraged to further their artistic risk-taking through the creation of their own works of art. This may include choreography, musical composition, theatre direction, art installation or exhibits and media projects. Students are also invited to audition for one or more of the many opportunities that are available to all students in our performance season.

# **VICTORIA'S ARTS SEASON**

The Victoria School arts season features one of the busiest production calendars in the city of Edmonton. The events on stage and in galleries showcase student performance and visual art work from across the K–12 curriculum. From showcases of class work and auditioned performance ensembles to full scale theatre, dance and music productions, the students' work is always challenging, diverse, highly focused and of an exceptionally high standard.

# THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMME

IB offers four programmes of international education, the Primary Years Programme (PYP: Gr. K–6), the Middle Years Programme (MYP: Gr. 7–10), the Diploma Programme (DP: Gr. 11–12) as well as a new addition, the Career Related Certificate Programme (IBCP: Gr.11–12).

#### **IB MISSION STATEMENT**

The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

IB programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

## HOW DO THE FOUR IB PROGRAMMES WORK TOGETHER?

The continuum of programmes forms a coherent sequence of education by promoting the education of the whole person through an emphasis on intellectual, personal, emotional and social growth. In all IB programmes, the education of the whole person is manifested through all domains of knowledge, involving learning in languages, humanities, sciences, mathematics and especially the arts.

# **ALL FOUR PROGRAMMES:**

- Require study across a broad range of subjects drawing on content from educational cultures across the world
- · Give special emphasis to language acquisition and development
- · Encourage learning across disciplines
- · Focus on developing the skills of learning
- Include, to a varying extent, the study of individual subjects and of transdisciplinary skills
- Provide students with opportunities for individual and collaborative planning and research
- Include a community service component requiring action and reflection

#### WHAT IS INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION?

The International Baccalaureate defines an international education according to the following criteria:

- Developing citizens of the world in relation to culture, language and learning to live together
- Building and reinforcing students' sense of identity and cultural awareness
- Fostering students' recognition and development of universal human values
- Stimulating curiosity and inquiry in order to foster a spirit of discovery and enjoyment of learning
- Equipping students with the skills to learn and acquire knowledge, individually or collaboratively, and to apply these skills and knowledge accordingly across a broad range of areas
- Providing international content while responding to local requirements and interests
- · Encouraging diversity and flexibility in teaching methods
- Providing appropriate forms of assessment and international benchmarking

# TRANSPORTATION

Students come from all over Edmonton and the surrounding area to attend Victoria School of the Arts. Though many students get rides from their parents or car pool, yellow busing is available for elementary students within the boundaries and guidelines set by Edmonton Public School's Student Transportation. Options for Yellow School busing can be discussed at the time of application. Secondary students are eligible for an Edmonton Transit System (ETS) bus pass which is valid for use 7 days per week, including statutory holidays.

Victoria School is situated on The Metro Line (North LRT to NAIT) which can be accessed from the Churchill LRT station in downtown Edmonton. Our central downtown location provides access to our school from approximately a dozen ETS bus routes.

# IF YES, THEN PLEASE SUBMIT AN APPLICATION (K-9) OR REGISTRATION PACKAGE (10-12)

An application process is in place for students wishing to enter Victoria School from Grades K–9. Placement is based on requirements having been met and availability of space. A registration process is in place for students Grades 10–12. Forms are available on our website www.victoria-school.ca or from our General Office.

Victoria School has an optimal enrolment limit for all grades. An optimal enrolment limit is a pre-determined maximum student enrolment number set jointly by the school and the District's Planning Department to ensure excellent teaching and learning conditions exist for all students in the school. In the event that demand for our program exceeds the optimal enrolment limit, a random selection will be conducted. The random selection process ensures an equal chance of admission of all eligible new students and is administered through the District.

For students registering from outside Edmonton Public Schools you will also need to complete an Edmonton Public School Registration Form available at www.epsb.ca.
