Crowsnest Consolidated High School (CCHS) is a vibrant public school, situated in the far west corner of the province along scenic Highway 3. Originally built in 1971 as a 9-12 school, the facility was modernized in 2005 and reconfigured to house junior and senior high. There are approximately 300 students in Grades 7-12, and a teaching staff of 21. CCHS is known for its strong academic programming and its diverse complementary course offerings. We are able to balance the need for courses such as English, Social Studies, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Math 31, and Mechanics, Welding, Carpentry thus meeting the needs of both career pathways. Other important courses include French, Art, Choral, Drama, Foods, Fashion Studies, Robotics, Environmental Science, Sports Performance (hockey), and Physical Education.
